Granny's Attic is coming – mark your calendars for this coming weekend.

Home Tour meetings are underway. We have five wonderful homes, seasoned House Captains and entertainment already underway for this year – September 21 and 22, along with the Sunday Tractor Show on the 22nd. Our homes range from 1852 to the 20th century this year. Volunteer to be a docent and get your attendance tickets for compensation.

At the museum, the Past Perfect software is humming along. With Bonnie Walworth at the helm and several new volunteers, all the accessions are up-to-date and many of the photos are being digitized. Great strides are being made in this area.

We have another group of volunteers who are looking at the gardening at all sites. Meeting this Thursday, we have three master gardeners who have expressed interest, and several others who will share their ideas to update the museum gardens, and work with the DDA for future plans. You are welcome to join us, or send in ideas.

The windows at the museum are moving along. Milford Glass has volunteered to fix the four broken panes in the inside windows at no cost to the museum. UV protective film has been added to most of the south, east and west windows, and for added protection UV shades have been added to those windows as well, replacing the green shades. The film provides 97% blockage of the UV rays and the shades block 98% of the UV rays. The storm windows are being worked on – several delays have occurred, but they will be in place soon.

We are thinking of an online store with Milford Historical Society shirt, hats, tote bags and more. The Board is looking at possible logos for the MHS and would have the new logo and our name available to be added to the wearing apparel and bags. Want to help? Call me.

A big thanks to Ron Campbell for his presentation on Train stations at our last "extra" general meeting. The meeting was very inspirational and the thought of obtaining the Milford Train Station and restoring it to its past glory, then adding a train museum and perhaps a community center for the town is an intriguing idea. Anyone want to work on this? I can think of several helpers.

Also – our Powerhouse engineering group is going forward with trying to make the water once again flow from the lake to the powerhouse. The engineers have measured and platted, tested the flume, and mapped the routes and equipment. With the addition of some money – they can do a feasibility study to get the water flowing. Should that be successful, the next steps would be adding generators and making water-powered electricity in Milford. The Board is also working to add the markers, children's tiles and pavers to the new amphitheater landscaping. It will be a beautiful area to listen to the concerts.

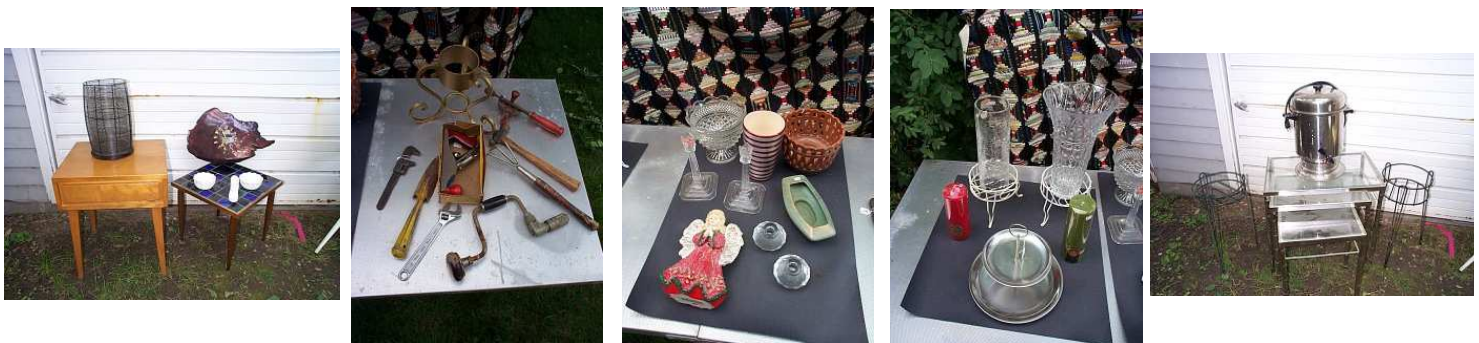
