May 30, 1874--We have heard it suggested that the time has arrived for taking the necessary steps toward the organization of an Episcopal Church in our village. We heartily approve the plan, and feel confident that a church with quite a respectable membership could be gathered together.

June 6, 1874-- The project of organizing an Episcopal Church in this village is meeting with a good deal of favor among our citizens. No more favorable opportunity will occur than the present.

Feb. 13, 1892- Episcopal services to be held in J.N. Browne's photographic rooms. [On west side of Main St., about where Rottermond's is now.]

June 10, 1899--Episcopal service at the G.A.R. Hall Tuesday afternoon. (Rev. Mockridge)

Oct. 7, 1899--Episcopal service at the G.A.R. Hall on Tuesday evening.

Dec. 30, 1899--Episcopal services, Rev. Mockridge of Detroit, at the G.A.R. Hall on Tuesday, January 2.
